# Scottish Table Tennis Association Table Tennis Scotland 

## CHRONOLOGY

| 1926 | Dr Georg Lehman (Founder Initiator) invited other country's representatives to Berlin, Germany in January with a view to setting up an International body to organise and control World events. The Hon. Ivor Montagu was founder President and served in that position until 1967. <br> The first I.T.T.F. Congress was held in London in December during the European Championships (later designated as the first world Championships due to the inclusion of India) |
| :---: | :---: |
| 1929 | Fred J. Perry became the first British World Champion winning the Men's Singles title in Budapest, Hungary. Fred later became known worldwide for his tennis career. |
| 1934 | Aberdeen became the first established association in Scotland followed by Edinburgh (1935), Dundee (1937), Perth (1938), West of Scotland (????), Stirlingshire (????) and Dumfries (195?). <br> Other association came and in time disbanded -Lanarkshire, North Larark, West Dumbarton, Orkney, Shetland, Inverness, Fife and Ayrshire. |
| 1936 | The Scottish Table Tennis Association was formed by Edinburgh Association Chairman and Secretary John A.T. Brown (1904-1977) and John S. Bathgate. Brown a banker was the first President of the S.T.T.A. and was Honorary Auditor of the I.T.T.F. from 1949-1958. Bathgate was the Association's first Chairman. |
| 1937 | Edinburgh played Glasgow and Stirlingshire in a triangular match. |
| 1943 | Despite being a new and small table tennis nation and with the unfortunate timing of being established just before the Second World War, Scotland still managed to arrange table tennis matches. One of those organised by the North East Region was a charity match held at The Music Hall, Aberdeen between Great Britain and the Allies. This match featured 1939 World Champion Richard Bergman and E.J. Filby with K. Sebestak and E. Berger playing for the Allies. During the interval of that match Cpl Bergman (sitting in a chair) played the highest bidder over one game. The winner was Lord Provost Mitchell with the money going to the Red Cross. Other such matches were organised in the late 40 's and early 50 's by the West of Scotland Table Tennis League and played at the St Andrew's Hall, Glasgow with the proceeds going to the J. N. F. Charitable Trust. |
| 1946 | Helen Elliot was invited to compete in the Irish Open Table Tennis Championships in Belfast and came away with the Women's Singles Title and this only three years since taking up the game. |
| 1947 | Scotland played their first International by sending both a men's and a women's team to the $14^{\text {th }}$ World Championships in Paris, France. The Scottish Women won two team matches and Helen Elliot reached the quarter finals of the Women's Singles. |

| 1947 | Scotland appointed its first national coach in the shape of former English Internationalist Ken Stanley. Ken spent 2 years in the post until the untimely death of Scottish Internationalist and Chairman Peter Coia. Peter was killed in an air crash when he was returning from the English Championships. |

| 1948 | At the $15^{\text {th }}$ World Championships held at Wembley, England in February Scotland Men won 2 matches and the Women won 3 matches. Helen again won through to the quarter finals of the Women's Singles and partnered by Dora Beregi of England reached the final of the Women's Doubles losing to Mrs V. Thomas and Miss M Franks of England. |
| 1949 | John A. T. Brown was appointed Hon. Auditor of the I.T.T.F. where he held the post until 1959 except 1957/58 where he was replaced by R. D. Dykes also from Scotland. No other Scot was elected to a position on the I.T.T.F. until Denis George was a corresponding member in the 1990's. |
| 1949 | Helen Elliot partnered by Gizelle Farkas of Hungary won the World Doubles Title (W.J. Pope Trophy) in Stockholm, Sweden. Helen also reached the quarter final of the Women's Singles for the third consecutive year. |
| 1950 | Helen retained her World Doubles Title this time paired with Dora Beregi of England. |
| 1955 | At the World University Games held in Warsaw, Poland, Helen won the Women's Doubles title with Angelica Rozeanu of Romania but lost to Angelica in the Women's Singles Final. Angelica at the time was 6 times World Women's Singles Champion. |
| 1963 | World Championships Prague: Men's Team Ian Barclay, Jim Dow, Robert Kerr \& Malcolm Sugden. Women's Team Olive Hawkings, Pat kerr, \& Doreen Robertson with NPC Eddie Still. |
| 1965 | World Championships Ljubjlana: Malcolm Sugden, Jim Dow, J Carswell \& Robert Kerr were $30^{\text {th }}$ out of 43 teams. Lesley Barrie, Olive Hawkings with Tommy McMichael NPC were $27^{\text {th }}$ out of 31 . |
| 1966 | Peter Cameron was selected to play in the Quadranular Internationals in Glasgow to become the first disabled player to play for the Senior Scottish Team. Scotland came 2 ${ }^{\text {nd }}$. Peter was then selected to play in the European Championships held at Wembley in London along with Malcolm Sugden, Jim Dow and Ian Barclay. <br> (In 2016 Peter remains the only disabled athlete selected for Scotland) |
| 1967 | World Championships, Stockholm: Malcolm Sugden, Brian Kean, Tommy McMichael \& Jim Dow were $27^{\text {th }}$ out of 41 . Malcolm won 15 out of 19 games. Leslie Barrie \& Olive Hawkings were $25^{\text {th }}$ out of 28 . |
| 1969 | A Czech team featuring J Stacek, S Kollarovits \& G Turai for the Men and I Vostova \& A Grafova for the women visited Scotland for 2 International matches. The first match in Edinburgh won a 9-1 defeat with Lesley Barrie \& Kathy Angus winning the woman's doubles. The second match in Glasgow was an 8-2 loss with Malcolm Sugden defeated Kollarovits and with Eric Sutherland Defeated Stanek \& Turai in the Men's Doubles. |
| 1969 | World Championships, Munich: Malcolm Sugden, Brian Kean, Eric Sutherland, Lesley Barrie \& Kathy Angus with NPC Harry Baxter. The men finished $22^{\text {nd }}$ out of 46 whereas the woman were $30^{\text {th }}$ out of 35 . Malcolm won 19 out of 24 games played and Lesly won 6 out of 12 . |
| 1969 | Malcolm got a late invite to the Nissen Invitation Event at Crystal Palace. He beat Trevor Taylor, Chester Barnes and Alan Hyde to win the first $£ 100$ prize at an English Event. |


| 1969 | There was first steps to establish an International standard for umpiring. !st edition of "Handbook for Umpires" was published. |

| 1970 | European Championships, Moscow: Malcolm Sugden, Eric Sutherland, Richard Yule \& Brian Kean with NPC Roger Murray finished $15^{\text {th }}$ out of 20. Malcolm excelled again winning 17 out of 18 games played losing only to $J$ Stanek(CZE). |
| 1971 | The first Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships were held in Singapore. Helen came out of retirement to play in the singles event. |
| 1971 | The Chinese Table Tennis Team came to Scotland in December. The team of Elaine Forbes, Kathy Angus, Richard Yule, Malcolm Sugden, Eric Sutherland with npc Harry Baxter put up a credible performance in losing only 5-3. Elaine, Richard and Malcolm were Scotland's successes. |
| 1972 | European Championships, Rotterdam: Malcolm won 14/18 Richard won 7/18 to finish in the highest position ever $14^{\text {th }}$ out of $27^{\text {th }}$. |
| 1973 | Richard Yule won a Bronze Medal in the Men's Singles at the $2^{\text {nd }}$ Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships held in Cardiff. Richard remains the only Scot to win a medal in the main singles events. |
| 1973 | World Championships, Sarajevo: Richard Yule 14/19, Eric Sutherland Brian Kean \& David Fraser were 34/52. Elaine Smith \& Kathy Angus 32/40 with Elaine winning 6 out of 9 games played. |
| 1974 | At the Spanish Open in Alcoy, Costa Blanca, Scotland had incredible success. The Scottish team of Richard Yule, Grace McKay and Russell Brown with npc John Braithwaite won the team event beating Belgium in the semi-final and Spain in the Final both with a 4-3 scoreline. <br> Richard went on to win the Men's Singles Title and the Mixed Doubles Title partnered by Grace. Belgian Marie-France Germiat and Grace won the Women's Doubles Title. |
| 1974 | At an invitation tournament in Bergan, Norway, Elaine Smith (Forbes) won the Women's Singles event. |
| 1976 | John McNee emulated Richard Yule by winning the Men's Singles Title at the Spanish Open. |
| 1976 | Maggie Jones won a Silver Medal at the Olympiad for the Disabled in Toronto, Canada. |
| 1977 | Maggie Jones won a Gold Medal at the International Paraplegic Games at Stoke Mandeville, England. |
| 1977 | At the Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships held in Guernsey, Elaine Smith (Forbes) won a Silver Medal in the Women's Consolation Singles. |
| 1979 | Scotland hosted the $5^{\text {th }}$ Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships held in April at Meadowbank Stadium, Edinburgh. <br> Keith Rodger beat David Hannah in the Semi-final and Graham Davies (Wales) in the final to win the Men's Consolation Singles. Carole Dalrymple reached the semi-final in the Women's Consolation Singles. |
| 1979 | Scotland introduced a new type of event for players. Assessment events proved very popular giving players more games where all the top players played each other in the final group matches. |
| 1979 | As a direct result of the success of the Commonwealths, The Scottish Sports Council agreed to finance the appointment of a National Coach, a Secretary and the setting up of a National Office. Graham Davies from Wales and Morag Blair were appointed and the STTA Offices were established at 7 Frederick |

| 1985 | Richard Yule was appointed Director of Coaching and Development for <br> Scottish Table Tennis Association replacing Graham Davies. |
| 1985 | Brian Wright won the Men's Singles at the European Maccabi Games. |
| 1988 | S.T.T.A. Chairman Henry (Harry) Baxter died at the age of 70. In 1942 Harry <br> won the N.o.S. Open the night Aberdeen was blitzed. Harry represented <br> Scotland between 1946-1949. From 1953 -1973 Harry was Team <br> Captain/Manager for the Scottish Teams over 150 times as well as being <br> delegate to the ITTF Forum. Between 1955-1966 Harry won the Veterans <br> Singles Title at the Scottish Open. Harry held the post of treasurer (1957-1972) <br> Vice Chair (1972/73) and Chairman from 1973 until his death in 1985. |

| 1989 | David Fairholm replaced Richard Yule as Director of National Coaching and Development. |
| 1989 | The Gambit Club of Edinburgh played its last point after 50 years in play. The Gambit were the most success club in Scotland with Bert Kerr involved for most of those years along with Helen Elliot. |
| 1993 | Denis George was awarded the I.T.T.F. Merit Award in Gothenburg, at the I.T.T.F. Congress. |
| 1995 | Ben Dawson followed Denis in receiving the I.T.T.F. Merit Award. STTA President presented Ben with his award at this year's AGM. |
| 19 | Euan Walker won a Silver Medal in the Consolation Singles at the European Championships held in Slovakia. |

The Scottish National League - A potted history
The Scottish National League was launched on $7^{\text {th }}$ February 1981 with 7 teams. Neil Foley Sports, Murrayfield Joola, College Rosslyn, Tynecastle, Central, Fife and Stirling.
In season 2 Neil Foley Sports changed their name to Coatbridge Lentec, Central added a second team with Rosslyn and Fife dropping out. New teams entering were Springburn, Falkirk (2 teams) Lasswade, Roseburn and Charlie's Angels. Central ' $A$ ' featured 3 current Scottish Internationalist in Richard Yule John Broe and David McIlroy.
In season 3 Clober Engineering Ltd agreed a 3 year deal to sponsor the National League. Last seasons winners Central 'A' changed their name to Greaves Sports and David Hannah signed for Murrayfield.
Clober disappeared into their second year then Scotrail took on the mantle for the next 3 years. In 1989 Leeds Building Society sponsored the next 2 years and that was the last of League sponsors.
The league numbers continued to ebb and flow with players finding more prestigious events to play in and eventually gave up the ghost in 1997.

## 1947HELEN (ELLIOT) HAMILTON

Born in Edinburgh on $20^{\text {th }}$ January 1927.

Helen did not take up table tennis until she was 16 when she played for Dalry First Aid Post before moving on to Murrayfield. She then had a long association along with Bert Kerr at the Gambit Club.

Only three years after taking up the sport, 1946 was the year everything took off when she won her first of 13 consecutive Women's Singles Titles at the Scottish Open. She also won the Irish Open Women's Singles Title in 1946.

Helen gained her first Scottish cap in 1947 appearing in the World Championships in Paris where to her credit she reached the quarter finals of the women's singles. In the 1948 World Championships held at Wembley in London, Helen again reached the quarter finals in the women's singles. Incredibly, partnered by Dora Beregi of England, she also reached the final of the women's doubles only to lose to Mrs V. Thomas and Miss M. Franks of England.

In Stockholm, Sweden, in 1949 Helen had a new experienced partner at the $16^{\text {th }}$ World Championships in Gizelle Farkas of Hungary. Helen became the first Scot to win a world title as she and Gizelle took the World Women's Doubles Title (W.J. Pope Trophy). Again Helen made it to the quarter finals of the singles.

In 1950 Helen travelled to Budapest, Hungary and played with previous partner Dora Beregi and retained her World Doubles Title. Helen if not consistent reached the quarter finals of the singles for the $4{ }^{\text {th }}$ consecutive year.

The World University Games in 1955 took place in Warsaw, Poland where Helen teamed up with another World Champion Angelica Rozeanu to win the Women's Doubles Title. Both Helen and Angelica contested the Women's Singles final with 6 times World Champion Angelica coming out as the winner.


Thirteen is said to be unlucky for some but not for Helen in 1958 as she won her $13^{\text {th }}$ consecutive Scottish Open Women's Singles Title.

During her playing career Helen coached at Butlins Holiday Camps during the summer months alongside Johnny Leach. Skegness, Pithelli, Clacton, Bognor and Ayr were the holiday camps where they unearthed future table tennis talent between 1955 and 1973.

## ELAINE (SMITH) FORBES

Born in Forfar on April $7^{\text {th }} 1955$
Success came early for Elaine when at the age of 9 she was 'Girl of the Week' whilst on holiday at Butlin's Holiday camp in Ireland.
In the 1964 finals held at Bognor Regis camp Elaine was News of the World Tiny Tots Champion.
Elaine repeated her triumph in 1966 and 1967 at the News of the World sponsored event.

Elaine's first senior title was at the age of 14 where she won the North of Scotland Open Women's Singles.
$1^{\text {st }}$ Junior International Cap was against England in 1968/69 season and the following year she gained her senior cap at the English Open.

In 1971 Scotland played China at Meadowbank Edinburgh. A team of Elaine, Kathy Angus, Malcolm Sugden, Richard Yule and Eric Sutherland with npc Harry Baxter lost in a creditable $5-3$ defeat with wins from Elaine, Malcolm and Richard.

In 1972 Elaine entered Edinburgh University studying History and Politics and attained a MA hons Degree. In her first year she was awarded her full blue colours for Table Tennis.
Elaine won the Women's Singles at the Scottish and British University Championships 3 years in a row as well as a few Women's and Mixed Doubles Titles.

In 1973 Elaine lost in the quarter finals of the Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships held in Wales and gained a No 8 Commonwealth ranking.

In 1974 she won the Women's Singles at an invitation event in Bergen, Norway.

In the same year Elaine was selected to play for British Universities in a Quadrangular event against Germany, Belgium and Netherlands where she won all her team matches. In the individual matches she won the Women's Singles and Mixed Doubles.

Also in 1974 Elaine returned to Butlin's for the Summer but this time as a coach at the camp in Ayr.

At the 1975 Spanish Open Elaine was unbeaten in the team event and partnered by Richard Yule was the Mixed Doubles Champions.

At the Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships held in Guernsey in 1977 Elaine won the silver medal in the Consolation Singles.

In 1977 Elaine's Table Tennis future was in doubt after a virus attack her knee injury. It was not all bad news as Elaine was appointed Deputy Manager at the new Lasswade High School Centre.

Elaine's return to top flight table tennis was in 1981/82 and she had immediate success by winning trebles at many of the open tournaments she entered which impressed the selectors enough for her to be included in the team to play in the European Championships and the 1983 World Championships in Tokyo.

In 1988 Elaine won the Scottish Coach of the Year Award presented by the British Association of National Coaches for her work at Lasswade Table Tennis Club.

Elaine played for top clubs wherever she was which included; Perth City Boys Club, Rifle Club Dundee and Edinburgh University.

In 2009 although now in her 50's Elaine is still competing in and winning Scottish Events.

## Richard Yule

Born in Aberdeen in 1950
In the 1970's Richard worked for S.W. Hancock run by Johnny Leach manufacturing Table Tennis bats.

Richard's first senior cap was in 1970 against Wales.
From 1971 Richard studied languages at Edinburgh University, and at the Sorbonne in Paris, Richard studied French Language and Civilisation. In 1982 he left Jordonhill College of Education with a Bed Hons in Physical Education.

In 1971 Richard won the Scottish Universities Men's Singles title but lost in the final of the British Universities Championships to Tony Clayton of England after beating Graham Davies of Wales in the Semi-Final.

In the same year Richard coached at Butlins Clacton for the Summer.
At the Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships in Cardiff Richard won the Bronze medal in the Men's Singles.

Richard was part of the Scottish team that won the team event at the 1974 Spanish Open. Richard went on to win the Men's Singles and the Mixed Doubles with Grace McKay.

In 1975 while playing for A.S. Messine (TTC) he started a rare treble by winning the French National League, the English National League with Sealink Milton Keynes in 1980 and the Scottish national League with Aberdeen in 1982.

In 1989 Richard was the Non-Playing Captain of the Scottish Women's Team that won the Bronze at Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships at Cardiff.

Richard retired from playing at National level in 1985 in which time he had amassed 285 Scotland caps. This was a record at the time for a Scottish Sportsman. He had played in 6 World Championships, 7 European Championships and 6 Commonwealths. Chester Barnes, Nicky Jarvis and Dennis Neale were all England's No1 when they were defeated by Richard. He worked in Edinburgh for the Scottish Sports Council before becoming the Director of Coaching and Development for the Scottish Table Tennis Association. From 1995 until he retired in 2013 Richard was the Chief Executive of the English Table Tennis Association. He was also elected to be a Director of C.C.P.R. in July 2005 for a two year term and was re-elected in 2007.

## CAROLE DALRYMPLE

Born Falkirk, $25^{\text {th }}$ May 1963
Carole gained her first senior cap at the age of 13 .
Carole's career was interrupted twice through injury, although they had nothing to do with table tennis. She broke her leg in 1978 playing football and then missed most of the 1983/84 season due to a broken collarbone suffered in a motorcycle accident.

In 1979 at the Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships in Edinburgh Carole reached the semi-final of the consolation singles. She went one better at the 1982 European Championships in Budapest, Hungary where she won silver in the consolation singles.

Carole was a member of the Scottish team which won the Home Countries Quadrangular Championships for the first time in its 13 year history.

At the Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships held in Cardiff in 1989 Carole, Janet Smith and Eleanor McIlroy won a bronze medal in the Women's Team Event with n.p.c. Richard Yule.

## Euan Walker

Born East Kilbride, $11^{\text {th }}$ May 1972
Euan started playing table tennis at home and soon competed in his first tournament at the age of seven. Although he did not win the schools event that year, he succeeded in 1980.

Euan's first club was the East Kilbride Table Tennis Club.
Being runner-up at the Scottish Primary Schools Championships was probably Euans breakthrough that led him to be invited to national training at Inverclyde with national coach Graham Davies. At about the same time Euan was invited to Bellahouston Sports Club to train under Andy Fleming which gave him the quality practice against other Scottish Internationalists on a regular basis.

Euan's first international as a Cadet was in 1986 with a European League Match in 1990 being his first of over 200 Senior Internationals.

Coaches played an influential role in his career from Bill Cummings at East Kilbride to Graham Davies, Andy Fleming, Richard Yule, David Fairholm and Kevin Satchell.

Apart from winning a record 12 Scottish Men's Singles titles, Euan's fondest memories were spending a month training in Japan, and parading with the Scottish Team at the Opening Ceremony at the 2002 Commonwealth Games in Manchester.

Euan attended 7 World Championships,
6 European Championships, 5 Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships, 4 European Youth Championships and
1 Commonwealth Games
He also played in the European League 1990 - 2005 and the Home Countries Internationals 1990-2005.

Other notable achievements were winning 3 British Men's Singles titles, a World ranking of 200 at the age of 17 , runner-up at the U.S. Open under 22 Men's Singles, runner-up at the European Championships Consolation Event, and being undefeated at the 2001 World Championships Team Event.
He was International Scools Champion in 1990 and was given a Commonwealth ranking of 11 in 1995. His biggest wins were Oliver Marmurek of France, and England's Alan Cooke, Carl Prean and Matthew Syed when Matthew was World ranked at No. 33.

## Bert Kerr

Born Edinburgh 1933
Bert started playing for Gambit aged 14 in the 1948/49 season.
Gambit won the Edinburgh \& District league title 31 times between 1944 and 1981 and the Scottish Team Cup 28 times 1946-1950 / 1952 / 1954-57 / 1959 and 1962-1974.

Gambit provided all 5 players for the 1955 World Championships, Tommy McMichael, Bert Kerr, Ian Barclay, Helen Elliot and Helen Houliston.

While on National Service Bert played 2 seasons for Rheydt RSU in the German Oberliga with Eberhard Scholer. Under Scholer's influence Bert developed a more defensive style.

Bert gained his first Scotland Cap in 1953 and played in 5 World Championships, London 1954, Utrecht 1955, Stockholm 1957, Prague 1963 and Ljubljana 1965 to take his international appearances to 166.
